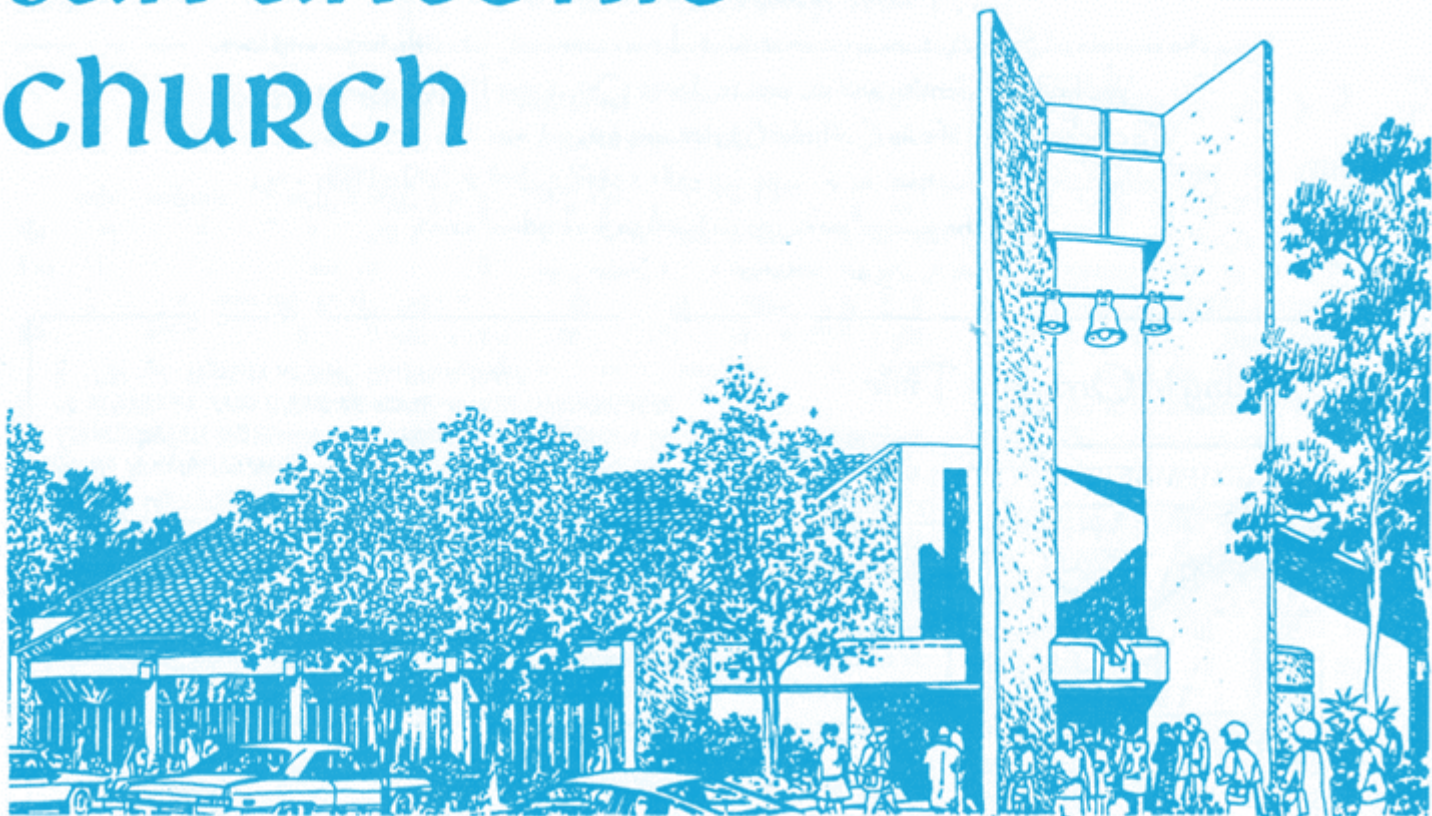

## My Fall from Grace

Well what a situation. By now most of you have heard something of what has happened to me. I am writing to keep the record straight, because I have heard already that Fr. Pat is lending his own version. And now, especially because he is coming to see me this week, he will have opportunity to add visual depth to even more elaborations. I am sure he is looking for any excuse to add commentary and humor to his stories to fill what otherwise would be very boring material. So, I am sorry to cut him short of something meaningful to say by telling you what really happened. Let me start by saying, that at least I have use of my two fingers to use the computer although I have to pause to rest my arms as they both are in casts and are very heavy. But it does give me something to do as TV is extremely boring and my eyes get tired of reading too much.

January 1 was a beautiful day. We had a beautiful morning mass. Fr. Peter was the main celebrant, I concelebrated and about 300 people showed up. I really enjoyed starting off the year with mass. Fr. Peter gave the homily then asked me to say something after communion. I did, which turned out to be a little longer as I was motivated by the moment. Someone, who will remain nameless at this point, but friends of Fr. Pat just to put it into context, said they couldn't remember when they had come to a mass they didn't have to and then sat through two homilies. Well, I hate to be indoors on a beautiful day as I am an outside person. I called a friend who has an airplane and he invited me to Fullerton to fly his airplane. Oh, give me a moment to think about that one. So I flew over Long Beach harbor. It was the most clear of days and I saw that it would be a beautiful sunset as Catalina looked like it was only a mile away. So after landing and putting things away, I went to Seal Beach and then to Los Alamitos Bay where all the boats are docked. I have gone there quite often to get my exercise, either riding my bike or fast walking. So I watched the most beautiful sunset, thought of my Mom as she loved the beach so, and then concluded my walk. It was dusk. I was going back to the car, but then thought I would walk down the cement steps to the lower pad to walk along the boat dock. It is funny how momentary changes can have such a drastic effect. I just wanted to get to my car, drive home and visit some people back here that evening. What I remember is looking down at the boats, at all the bird droppings on the step area (they have some really large birds down there) and then looking up at the tree to see if I would be walking under any. That is the last I remember. My doctor says that is normal. What I think happened, despite what Fr. Pat has said, is that when I was looking up, I tripped as my toe knuckle is sprained and that is the only thing on my lower body that got hurt. I landed on the right side of my head with my wrists tucked under me in an awkward position. X-rays show breaks but no separation in both wrists requiring no pins, but needing to be immobilized from above the elbows. Just try brushing your teeth or combing your hair, or taking a shower like that. Even eating is an adventure of a lever system between the fingers of both hands. After 65 years of being on my own, being Dutch and Danish, one inherits some traits of being independent. This is a VERY new experience for me, except for my heart surgery 5 years ago, which is a different set of limitations. Even though my face looks like I was hit by a Mack truck, this seems to be the extent of my injuries. They did do a CT scan and found nothing in my skull, which I'm sure Fr. Pat could have told them without doing an examination. So, the question I have is what happened? I don't remember tripping or falling. My Dr. said that is normal. In fact, he said I remember more that most would. But I need to fix this so it doesn't happen again. I guess I finally have to admit that my body is older than my mind says I am. I am not that agile, quick reacting, and recovering person I used to be. I just must get it in my thick skull (which may have saved me this time) I have to be more careful and vigilant of where I walk and what I do. It is something I don't like to admit, but I now have some very experiential knowledge of the consequences of not accepting the truth. Because, this folks, is the pits. I was initially upset with my Mom for allowing this to happen, but after listening to my doctor, saying how lucky I was, I guess I have to credit her with that. If I was going to have a bad fall, some of the really bad things were eliminated. So, I guess thanks are in order.

Well, here are the consequences. I am in double arm casts from the palms to above my elbows for the next 6-8 weeks, and he said I will be off golf for at least 3 months, yikes! By the time you read this I will have seen an Orthopedic doctor. My primary doctor said it will be his judgment as to whether the cast will be below or above the elbow. I think he wanted to give me some hope. I DID NOT ask what the percentages were. But it will be 6-8 weeks from that time. I pray for below the elbow as that will give me much more mobility. But, what will be will be.

I am a person IN SERVICE to others, and priding myself on taking care of my self and necessities, this is an immediate change in my life. I can't do for myself and have to allow others to do for me. Now I know the feelings that some of you have gone through, and what my Mom and other family members went through. But I also know the other side of that coin. I know the pleasure it gives me in being needed and doing something for others. So, I must learn to accept that. I do want to thank all those who have been very helpful so far. I DO need your help. Wow, that is a new one for me. I have always needed you spiritually, as that is what motivates me to be a priest, to minister to your needs, to prepare my preaching and grow in my own Faith. But now I need you in other ways too. Fr. Peter has been an angel, he even makes me coffee early in the morning as he knows I get up early. And there are those who have brought over food and shared their meal with us; thank you so much. This week I will know more of what my personal needs will be for the next 8 weeks. Fr. Peter will compile a list and they will be kept at the parish office. I apologize to Laurie our secretary, for putting her through this too. Obviously, I would change all this if I could but, in the final analysis, it is what it is. It was an accident, I fell because I was inattentive, and I need some help. I wonder if this is a case for looking into the issue of a Married Clergy, again.

Thank you all for your concern, for your help, but also for your prayers. Pray for a speedy recovery if you can. Fr. Pat might say I should have more humility and expect that many might come to like Fr. Peter being in charge. I presume, however, Fr. Peter might be praying otherwise. At any rate, thank you all so much. I am sorry this happened. If I could change it, I would in a heart beat. Obviously, I have a lot of time on my hands (and not much else in my hands at this point), so there will be many prayers and rosaries I say for you all. If you are interested and not completely bored, I will let you know my progress.

## Adult Confirmation Classes & Requirements

To become a fully initiated Catholic, three sacraments are required; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation.

If you or someone you know is 18 years or older and hasn't been confirmed and wants to complete the initiation process please sign up for the upcoming classes. Call Mrs. Liming at 714-970-6099 to register for these classes.

Classes will begin on Wednesday, February 3, 2010 at 7:30–9:00 p.m. in Conference Room 1.

Your Baptism certificate and Eucharist certificate are required. If you are married, your marriage certificate will also be required. You should also be practicing your Catholic faith and have a desire to complete the initiation process to become a fully initiated Catholic. Those Catholics who have received all three sacraments mentioned above are able to be sponsors. You will be asked to have a sponsor and they may also take the classes with you.

Confirmation for Adults will be held on Pentecost Sunday, May 23, 2010. Watch the church bulletin for more details.

## Baptism of the Lord God Made Manifest

An epiphany is a manifestation of God in visible form. Today's scriptures are replete with references to ways that God was made manifest. Isaiah sees "the glory of the LORD ... revealed" in the visible form of God renewing the covenant by bringing the Israelites home from exile. Psalm 104 presents God's "manifold works," singing: "When you send forth your spirit ... you renew the face of the earth" (Psalm 104:30). The reading from Titus takes up this theme of renewal as a manifestation of God. It mentions three "appearances" of God—in the person of Jesus, in glory in the fullness of time, and in our baptismal "renewal by the Holy Spirit." Finally, God was made manifest in Jesus' baptism when "the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove and a voice came from heaven" (Luke 3:22).

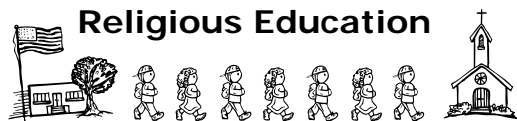
### Baptized with the Holy Spirit and Fire

What do all these epiphanies have to do with us? Titus assures us that the same Spirit of God who renews the universe, renewed the covenant, and descended upon Jesus has been "richly poured out on us" in "the bath of rebirth." With Jesus, we have been baptized "with the Holy Spirit and fire."

Those of us who were baptized as infants may not remember our baptism; even less might we remember our experience of God made manifest in us that day. Yet every time our community prays the Eucharistic Prayer and shares in Holy Communion the Spirit descends upon us again, pouring out the divine life that renews and "fires" us. As we move into Ordinary Time we will hear how the Spirit propelled Jesus forth to proclaim the Good News. Through our sharing in the Holy Spirit in baptism and Eucharist we, too, are propelled forth to make Christ manifest in the world.

God is manifested in visible form today by the renewal and the "fire" of all the baptized.

Today's Readings: Isaiah 40:1–5, 9–11; Psalm 104:1b–4, 24–25, 27–30; Titus 2:11–14; 3:4–7; Luke 3:15–16, 21–22

### Apostles of the Good News

The baptism of Jesus may seem odd to us. John called the people to repent and be baptized and then urged them to go and live good lives. The Savior of the world needs baptism? Yet, as John foretold, the power of the Spirit pours upon Jesus. He is the Beloved Son, or as Saint Paul says, the one “who gave himself for us, to deliver us from all lawlessness and to cleanse for himself a people as his own, eager to do what is good” (Titus 2:14). Before his ascension, Jesus appeared to his *disciples* or followers. John, he said, had baptized with water, but they “in a few days . . . will be baptized with the Holy Spirit” (Acts 1:5). At Pentecost the power of the Spirit fills them. They become *apostles*—the ones sent forth with the Good News—healing, forgiving, binding up wounds, teaching, and preaching. We are disciples as we learn more about Christ, but also apostles. Saint Teresa of Ávila said:



Christ has no body now but yours,  
no hands, no feet on earth but yours,  
yours are the eyes with which he looks compassion on this world,  
yours are the feet with which he walks to do good,  
yours are the hands with which he blesses all the world.
